- Reauthorization of [the Farm Bill](#)
 - The Farm Bill is a legislative package that is reauthorized (or passed) approximately every five years by Congress. The last version was signed into law by President Trump in 2018 and extended until September of 2024. While the Committee on Agriculture in the U.S. House of Representatives and the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry in the U.S. Senate have been diligently working on updates to the law, action is necessary before the current law expires. Twelve titles are included in the bill, and each has a broad impact on the future of agriculture.

Education

- Career Cluster Framework Revision
 - In 2022, Advance CTE announced the relaunch of an initiative to modernize the National Career Clusters Framework. The new framework is expected to be finalized and released in Fall 2024. It is designed to provide structural alignment and a common language to bridge education and work, empowering learners to explore, decide and prepare for dynamic and evolving careers.

- Federal Funding
 - Each year, the federal Government appropriates (or spends) approximately \$1.4B on state formula grants (basic state grants), directly impacting the flow of dollars into local career and technical education programs. As this number expands and contracts through the federal budgeting process, the investment made at the local level has a corresponding relationship. Groups like the Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE) advocate annually for increased investment in Perkins.

- Teacher Recruitment and Retention
 - Recruiting and preparing future agriculture teachers through traditional and nontraditional licensure pathways, including teachers with and without agricultural experiences, is essential for the viability of school-based agricultural education. Many of today's future teachers have limited firsthand agricultural experiences beyond that which they can glean from their own high school agriculture programs. This also includes preparing industry-experienced teachers (lateral entry/alternative licensure) to be effective in the classroom, with SAE, and with FFA.
