Writing – Feature Story

- In-depth personal look at a topic
- Have depth and are designed to get a reaction
 - Human Interest, Profiles, Behind the Scene, Seasonal or How-To
- Not Opinion or Creative Writing Still Factual
- Variety of Styles
 - Inner story and outer story
 - Narrative, news, narrative
 - Flashback, dramatic moment, etc.
- Still must cover: who, what, why, when, where





Writing – Feature Story

- Writers will write a news story for FFA New Horizons magazine using the provided materials and press conference information. It should be written for the magazine's target audience, have a strong focus and lead (opening paragraph), and include a headline.
- 350-500 words
- Scoring: The writers will be scored on the following criteria

0	Lead/Focus	15 points
0	Accuracy of information and quotes	15 points
0	Clarity and conciseness	10 points
0	Correct style (AP)	10 points
0	Depth of coverage	10 points
0	Header/Headline	10 points

Design: Magazine Layout Design

- Designers will use the press packet and information gathered in the press conference to develop a magazine layout for FFA New Horizons using the feature story text written by the news writer. Various photos, graphics, and logos will be provided for use in these layouts. Designers may use any page layout software available (i.e., Canva, Adobe Express, InDesign, etc.) if it appropriately tells the story and represents a design in FFA New Horizons. The magazine designer must use the text written by the news writer or provided text. Layouts will be saved and submitted in a PDF for judging.
- Designers will be scored on the following criteria

a)	Overall aesthetics of design	20 points
b)	Technical skills specific to activity	20 points
c)	Use of graphic design principles	20 points
d)	Neatness and creativity	20points
e)	Choice and placement/cropping of	20 points
	photo(s) and graphics	
g)	Total	100 points



Design Tips

- Think about typography
 - o Formal, informal, turned words, bold or thin
- Create infographics to help catch attention and visually tell the story
- Think about intentional white space or lack of white space
- Select high quality images
- Consistent theme/look and feel
 - Use logos, and colors that complement your theme



Electronic Media: Social Media Plan

Social media planners will develop posts to accompany and promote their team's magazine story. The strategy should be for a one-week flight, involve at least three social media platforms (such as Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, Twitter, Snapchat, or others), and contain a minimum of seven posts. Students may use any design software to create the posts (Canva, Adobe Express, Photoshop, Illustrator, InDesign). These are all acceptable software for this practicum but are not the only software options available. The plan must be submitted in PDF format, including screenshots, links and/or embedded images of each created post. Downloaded posts and videos may be included in the social media package

Electronic Media: Social Media Plan Tips

- Focus on a few key channels
- Determine your audience
- Match posts with key activities locally or nationally
- Create a cohesive theme so that it is clear the posts are connected
- Choose images or videos that tell the story
 - Add logos or branding where applicable
- Posts should encourage action
 - Click on a link to learn more, register, donate
 - Share post
- Include alt text in descriptions



Broadcast or Video Media: Broadcast Production

• Broadcasters will receive video and/or audio clips, photos, and/or music to create a 60 to 90-second story for the FFA New Horizons website. This can be a television story, online video, radio story, podcast, or slide show. This broadcast product can be used to promote readership of the story created by their team, or it can supplement what is in the written story – it is up to the team to decide the best use of these resources. Students will need to provide their own headphones and software. Spotify for Podcasters, Adobe Premiere, Express, Rush, or Audition; Canva Video; iMovie; Movie Maker; Anchor; BounceCast; or PodCastle are all acceptable software for this practicum but are not the only available software options. To be submitted for judging, broadcast productions must be exported to the student's device in a standard format, such as mp4 or mov.

Electronic Media – Video

- Compile video clips, photos and music to create a story that promotes the presenters product or service
- Story should run from 60 to 90 seconds
- Convey accurate information
- Cover: who, what, when, where, why, how
 - Images should help illustrate the 5 w's and 1 h




Photo Tips

RULE OF THIRDS

Imagine the photograph is divided into thirds horizontally and vertically. Good photo composition suggests that photo subjects should be placed at or near the intersections of these lines. Avoid placing objects directly

in the center. Photos with centered subjects tend to be more static and less interesting than photos with off-centered placement.



LINES

Lines can add dynamics to photos. They usually lead into the photo and provide a path for the eye to follow to the main subject.

BALANCE

Good balance depends on the arrangement of shapes, colors or areas of light and dark that complement one another so that the photo looks balanced, not lopsided. Balance can be symmetrical or assymetrical.

FRAMING

Frame the center of interest with objects in the foreground. Framing gives the picture a feeling of depth. Common framing elements include tree branches, buildings, shadows, etc.

SIMPLICITY


Simplify photos by selecting uncomplicated backgrounds, avoiding unrelated subjects and moving in close. For a more dynamic center of interest, place it slightly off center.



AP Style and Editing

- Capitalize only formal titles when using a name
 - Do not use courtesy titles
 - Spell out numbers under 10
 - Write out number if starts sentence
 - State abbreviations unique
