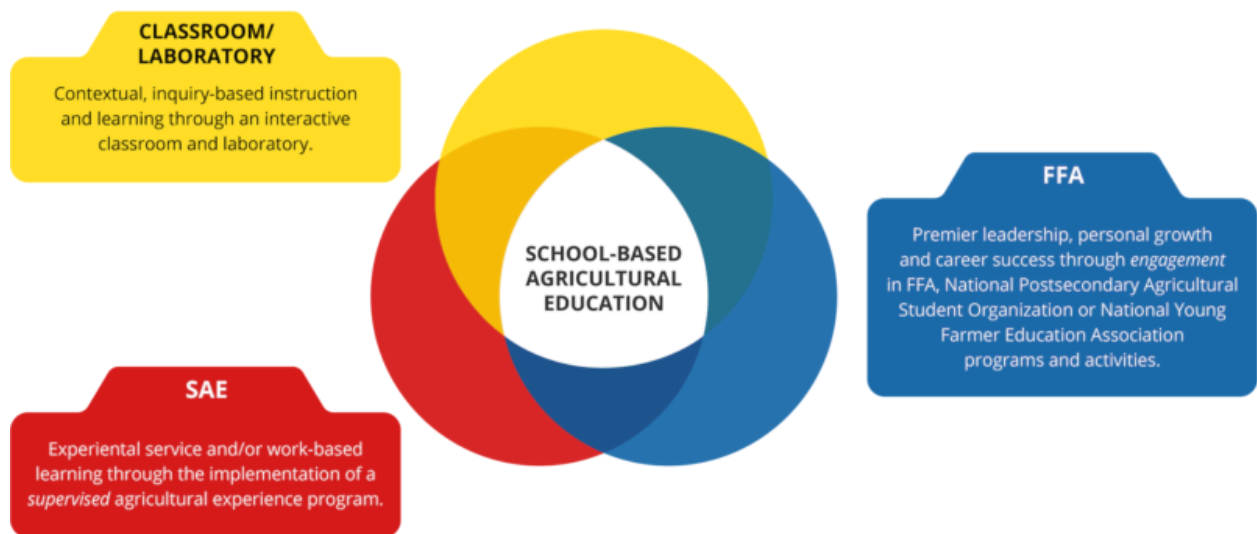

Vision: Growing the next generation of leaders who will change the world.

Mission: FFA makes a positive difference in the lives of students by developing their potential for premier leadership, personal growth, and career success through agricultural education.

Three- Circle Model: FFA is one component of the three-circle model of school-based agriculture, food, and natural resources education, meaning it is an intra-curricular student organization for those interested in agriculture, food, and natural resources, and leadership.



That means all of our students complete:

- State-accredited agricultural education courses at their school (classroom/laboratory experience)
- A work-based learning project, called a Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE)
- Leadership development activities (FFA)

General Talking Points:

FFA develops members' potential and helps them discover their talents through hands-on experiences, which gives members the tools to achieve real-world success.

Studies show FFA members are higher academic achievers and possess higher levels of communication, decision-making, teamwork, and leadership skills than their non-FFA peers.

Our students are future farmers, chemists, veterinarians, conservationists, food scientists, engineers, policy makers, entrepreneurs, bankers, international business leaders, teachers, and premier professionals in the fields of agriculture, food, and natural resources. And even if they pursue careers outside the industry, they leave our programs as more informed consumers and community members who understand where their food, fiber, and fuel comes from and how this essential industry operates.

Michigan FFA Stats:

Michigan is home to **10,047 FFA members** from **135 chapters** across the state.

Last year, Michigan FFA members generated **\$5.3 million** in income from their Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects.

Last year, Michigan FFA members invested more than **34,526 hours** of service in their communities.
